Save Water - Class 5

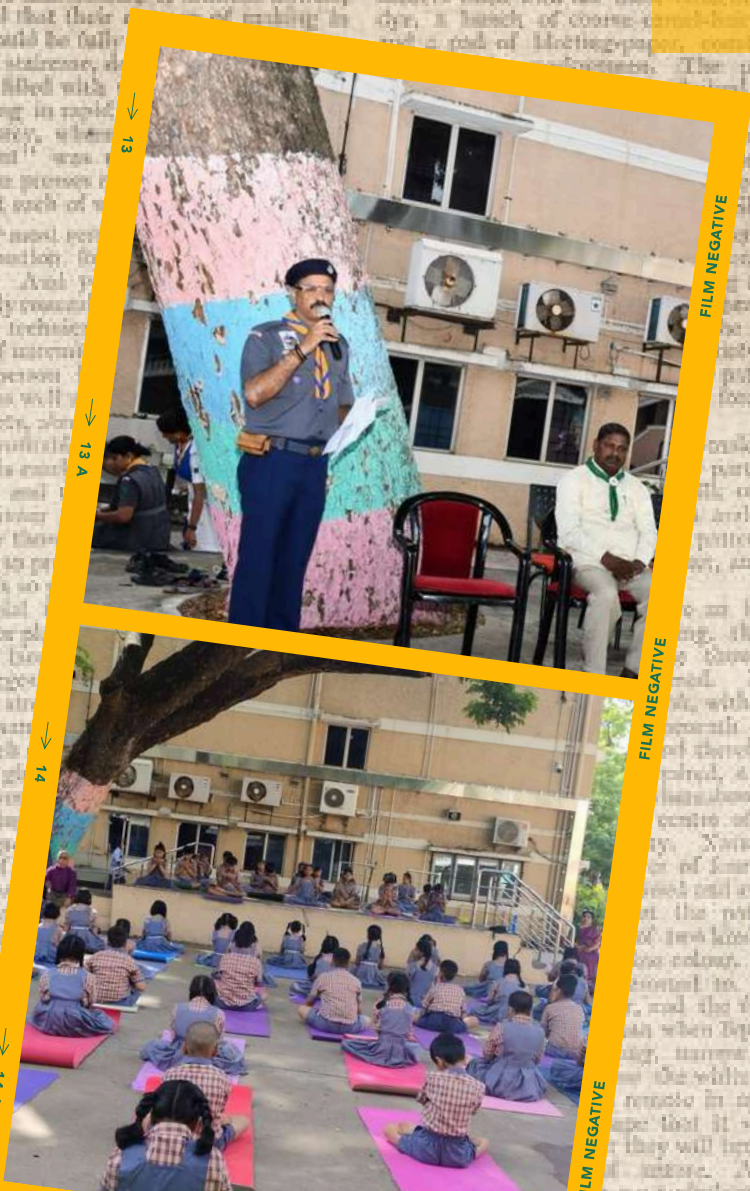

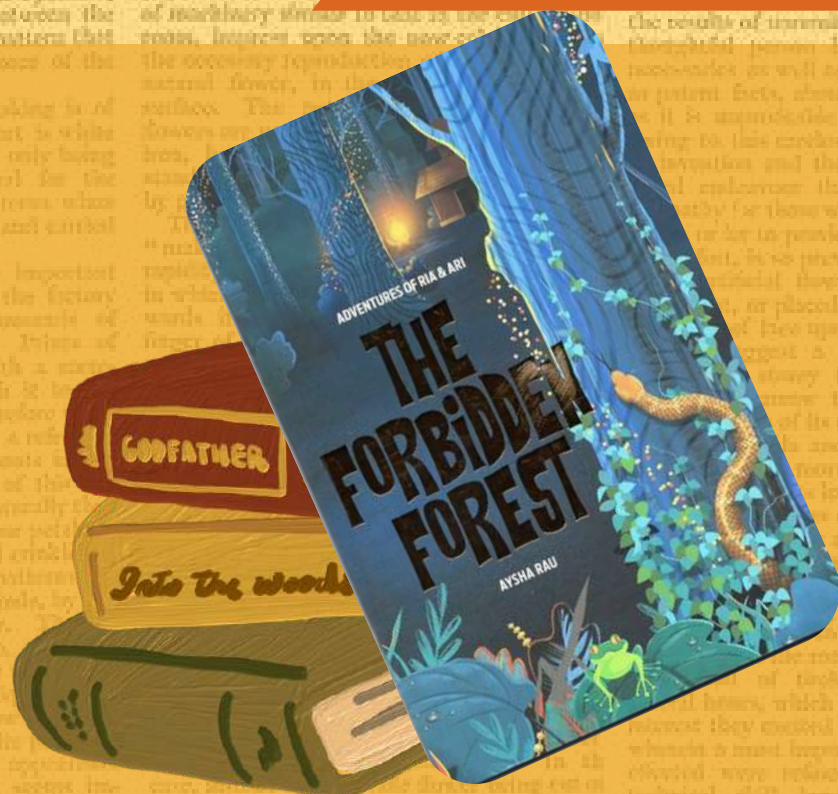
National Reading Day

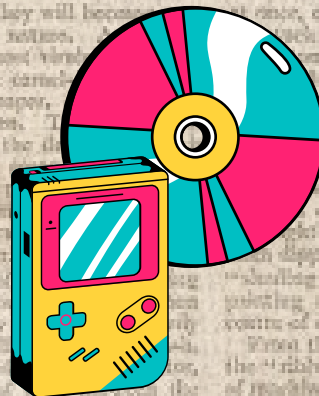

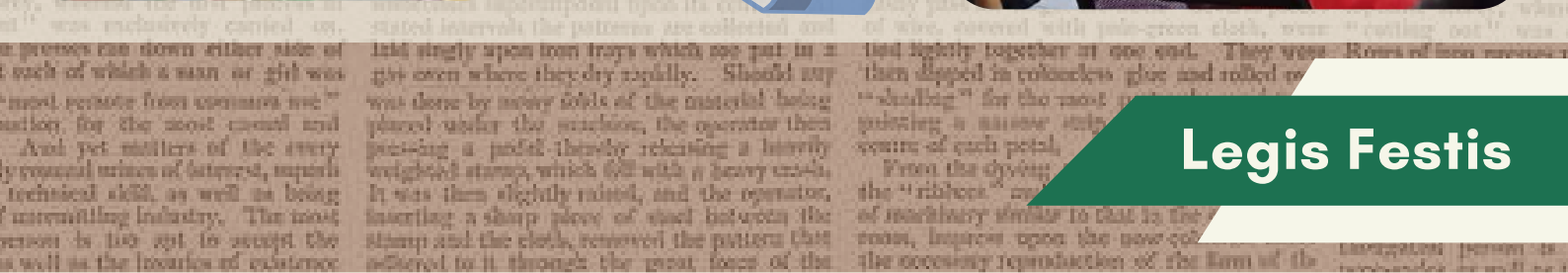
Union Christian

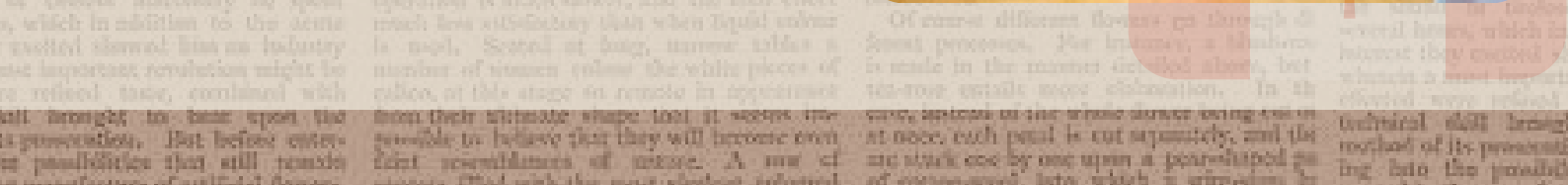

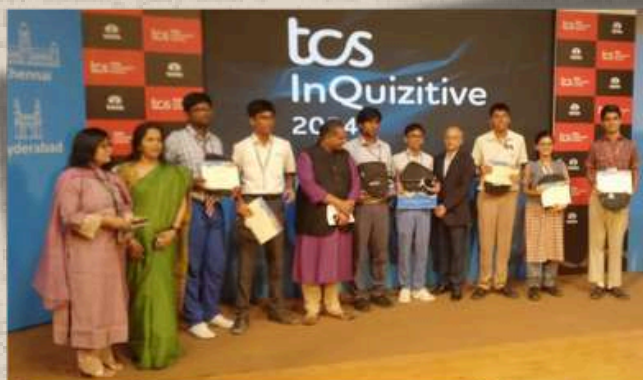
Teachers' Competitions

TCS Quiz

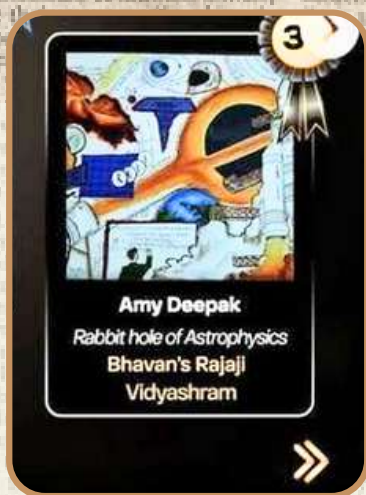

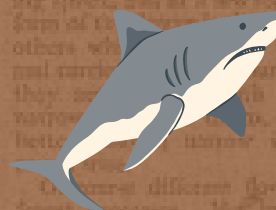
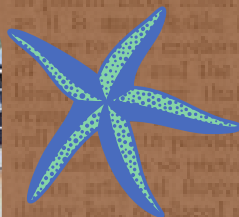
Egmore Museum

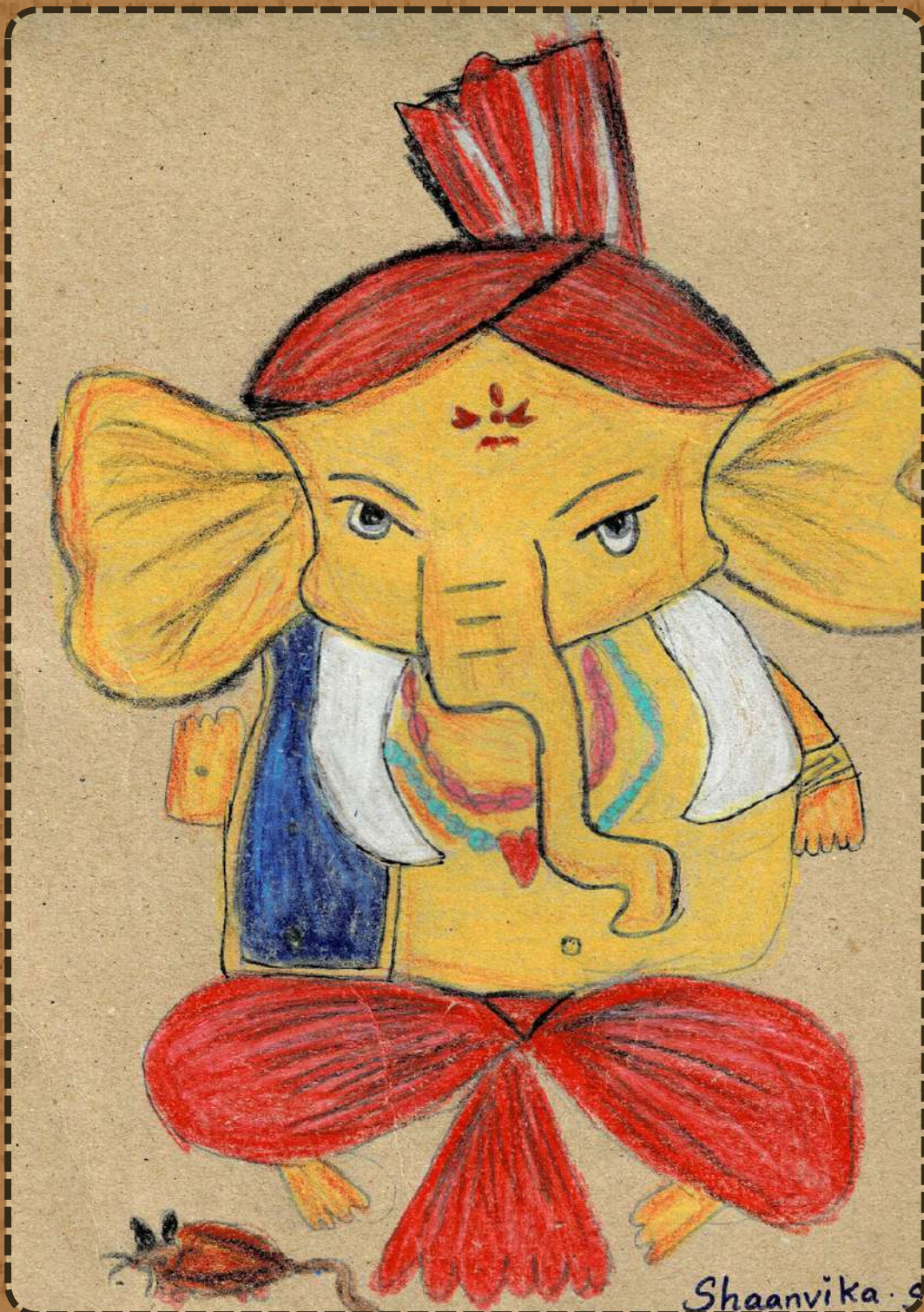


Pondicherry Trip

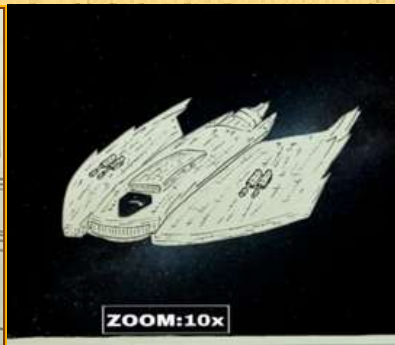
