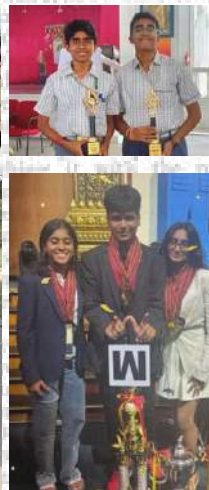

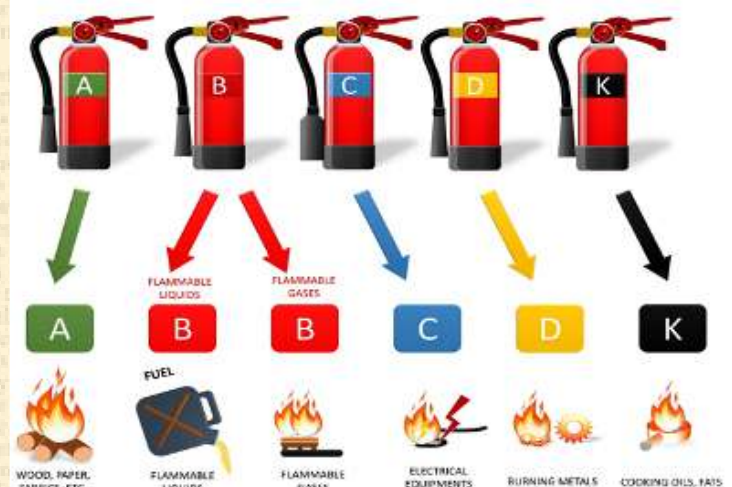

4. NCF-FS 2023

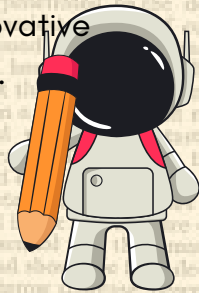
The objective of the program was to equip teachers with effective pedagogical strategies and processes to foster holistic education in the foundational stage, with a special emphasis on phonics.

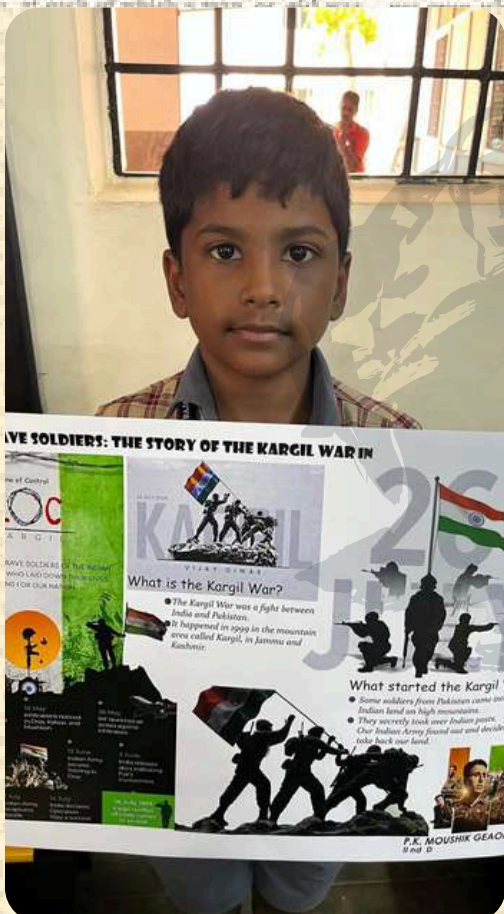


Kargil Diwas

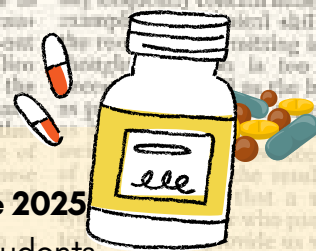

City Level Oratorical Competition



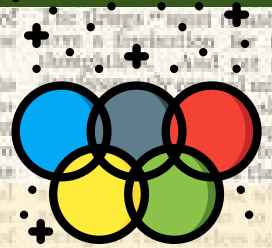

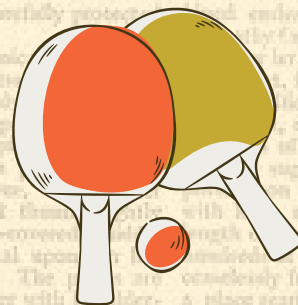

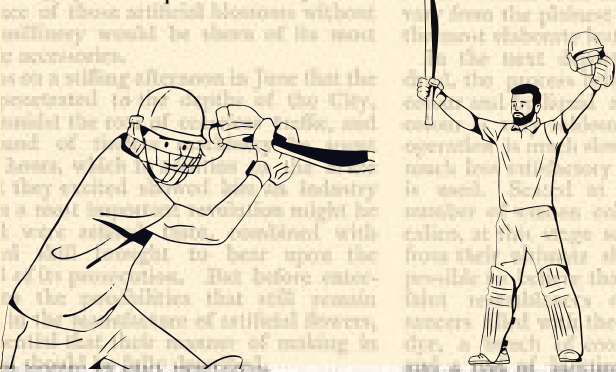
Velayutham Sir

The event encouraged entrepreneurial thinking through segments like Shark Tank Pitch, Logo & Slogan Design, Adzap, and Business Quiz.



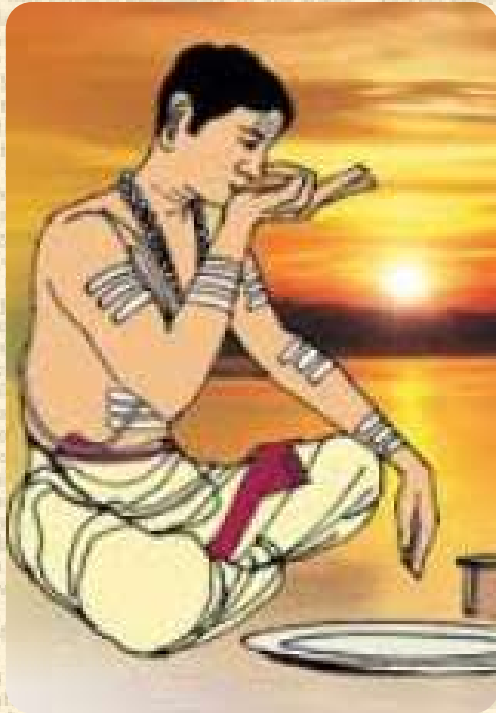
Magnum Opus UCPS

Furthermore, Sai Ishitha was recognized as Ms. Magnum Opus and received a bicycle as a reward for her accomplishments.

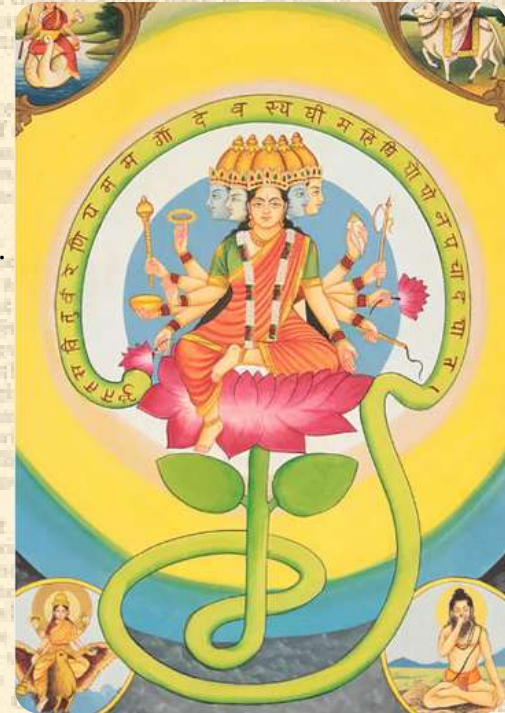


Avani Avittam, Gayathri Japam

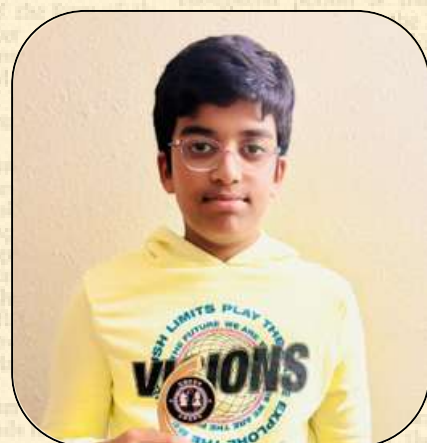


CREST International Spellbee & UCTO

The event helped the students understand the importance of kindness, compassion, and service to humanity.



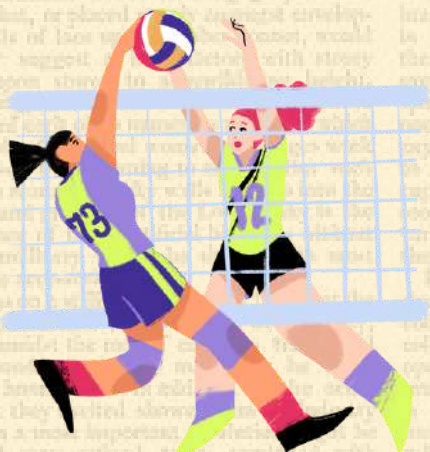
Staff Competitions

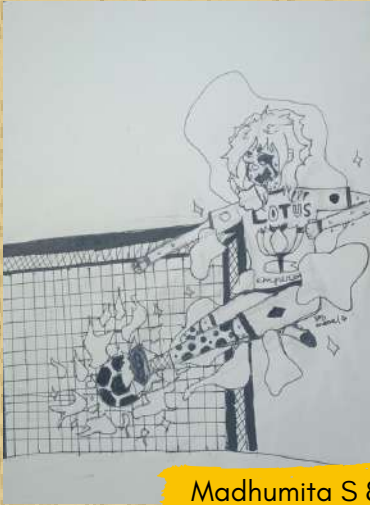

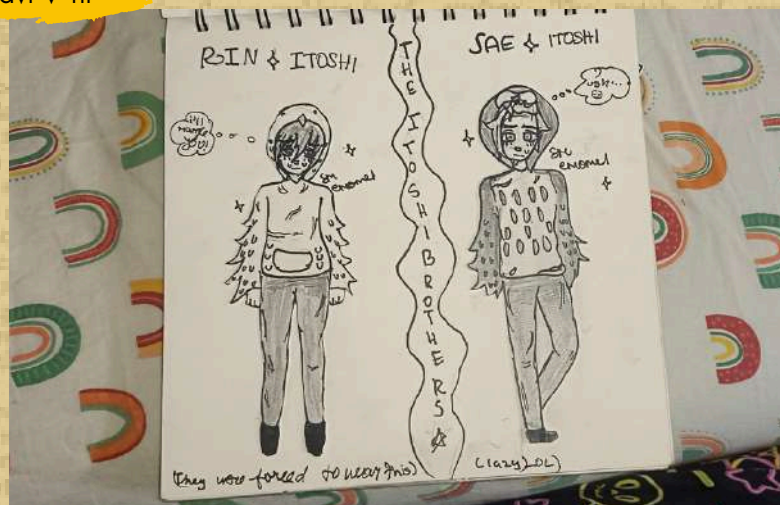
